## Livestock Competitions

### Rules and Regulations

1. All entries must be accompanied by proper address or Society will not be responsible for payment of prize money.
2. A membership of \$5.00 (five dollars) must be paid on or before the day of the show.
3. Entry Fee: Ten percent of amounts of \$10.00 (ten dollars), or over awarded to exhibitors will be retained by the Society unless specified otherwise.
4. To become a member of the Hanover Agricultural Society and to have voting privileges at the Annual Meeting, to be held the third Tuesday of January, the person must hold the previous years' membership and the current years' membership.
5. Animals or articles exhibited must be the property of the exhibitor.
6. Judges shall use their discretion as to awarding first, second, and third premiums, and in all cases where they do not think the animal worthy they shall withhold the premium. Judges should also note reasons for their choices.
7. Any person who shall attempt to interfere with the Judges while in the discharge of their duty, or shall, on the premises of the Society, use any contemptuous or abusive language to any Judge or Officer of the Society, shall forfeit his or her right to any premium to which he may be entitled and shall be excluded from exhibiting for one year thereafter.
8. In all cases of doubt or difficulty that may arise, before making their awards, the Judges shall submit the matter to one of the Directors and the President and two or more Directors shall finally settle the same. The decision of the Judge or Judges shall be final as to awarding prizes and no appeal shall be considered except in case of protest. All protests shall be made in writing and shall be delivered within one hour after the award at the Secretary's office. Any exhibitor or interested person making such protest will be required to deposit the sum of \$5.00 and if said protest be not sustained said deposit shall be retained by the Society. The President and two Directors shall decide all protests.
9. All members, attendants and visitors are particularly requested to keep off the track so as to ensure their own safety and to prevent accidents. The society is not responsible for any accidents on the grounds.
10. Persons under 16 years of age entering in adult classes must pay membership fee.
11. In case an error occurs in the printing of the Prize List, the Directors have power to rectify same. Prizes will be paid on classes only in the book and no extra classes will be allowed.
12. All cheques must be cashed by December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2018 otherwise they will not be honoured.
13. All livestock exhibitors must show proof of liability insurance.
14. All livestock may be subject to veterinarian inspection.

- All entries must be accompanied by an entry form with proper address or Society will not be responsible for payment of prize money.
- A 2018 membership of \$5.00 (five dollars), must accompany the entry form.

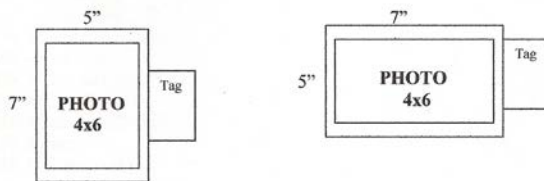

Row 2 and all even rows: Purl

Row 3: (K7.K2tog) 8 times.

Row 5: (K6.K2tog) 8 times.

Row 7: (K5.K2tog) 8 times.

Continue decreasing in this manner until you have completed the row (K2tog) 8 times.

Break yarn and thread end through remaining 8 sts.

Finishing:

Sew back seam edge to edge. Weave in yarn end.
