Rules and Regulations: ALL EXHIBITS MUST BE PLACED AT THE RACEWAY THURSDAY, AUGUST 10TH BETWEEN 7:00-9:00 p.m. AND REMAIN UNTIL SUNDAY, AUGUST 13TH AT 3:00 p.m.

- 1. All entries must be delivered in person to the Directors appointed to take charge of the showroom between 7:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m. on Thursday, August 10th with entry tags attached, and placed in their respective classes under their direction at the Raceway.**
- Entry tags will be available when items are dropped off or can be picked up in advance at Hanover Raceway Restaurant.
- 3. EXHIBITS MUST BE REMOVED AT 3:00 p.m. SUNDAY AFTERNOON.** No article exhibited in the show shall be removed before 3:00 p.m. Those exhibits may, if the Directors decide, lose their prize money.
- All entries must be accompanied by an entry form with proper address or Society will not be responsible for payment of prize money.
- A 2017 membership of \$5.00 (five dollars), must accompany the entry form.
- Entry Fee: Ten percent of amounts of \$10.00 (ten dollars), or over awarded to exhibitors will be retained by the Society for all classes unless specified otherwise.
- To become a member of the Hanover Agricultural Society and to have voting privileges at the Annual Meeting, to be held the third week of January, the person must hold the previous year's membership and the current year's membership.
- Animals or articles exhibited must be the property of the exhibitor.
- Produce must be growth of the current year, and must have been grown by the exhibitor.
- Persons under 16 years of age entering in adult classes must pay membership fee.
- While the Directors will take every possible precaution under the circumstances to insure the safety of the articles brought to the exhibition, the owners themselves must take the risk of exhibiting, and should any article be accidentally damaged, lost or stolen the Directors will give all assistance in their power towards the recovery but will not make any payment for the value thereof.

12. No more than one premium on one item in any class will be awarded to any exhibitor, or paid if awarded except in the case of animals as stated in the respective classes.
13. Judges shall use their discretion as to awarding first, second, and third premiums, and in all cases where they do not think the animal or article worthy they shall withhold the premium. Judges should also note reasons for their choices.
14. Any person who shall attempt to interfere with the Judges while in the discharge of their duty, or shall, on the premises of the Society, use any contemptuous or abusive language to any Judge or Officer of the Society, shall forfeit his or her right to any premium to which he may be entitled and shall be excluded from exhibiting for one year thereafter.
15. In all cases of doubt or difficulty that may arise, before making their awards, the Judges shall submit the matter to one of the Directors and the President and two or more Directors shall finally settle the same. The decision of the Judge or Judges shall be final as to awarding prizes and no appeal shall be considered except in case of protest. All protests shall be made in writing and shall be delivered within one hour after the award at the Secretary's office. Any exhibitor or interested person making such protest will be required to deposit the sum of \$5.00 and if said protest not be sustained said deposit shall be retained by the Society. The President and two Directors shall decide all protests.
16. A male or female can participate in any category listed.
17. In case an error occurs in the printing of the Prize List, the Directors have power to rectify same. Prizes will be paid on classes only in the book and no extra classes will be allowed.
18. All cheques must be cashed by December 31st, 2017 otherwise they will not be honoured.

Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies Hand Quilted Quilt Competition

Eligibility, Rules and Regulations (for classes 1 through 7)

General Conditions

- A. Entries must be solely made and hand quilted by the exhibitor and exhibited and judged at a local Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies (OAAS) to be eligible for this competition.
- B. Entry quilts must be a minimum of 324" measured on the perimeter. Smaller quilts will not be eligible to proceed to the next level of competition.
- C. The winner's name and pattern to be displayed at the Fair on sign provided by OAAS.
- D. Judging will occur at local fairs and district levels. A Provincial Grand Champion Quilt will be selected at the Annual OAAS Convention.
- E. Upon making an entry into the Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies Quilt Competition, the Exhibitor agrees to participate in any promotional activities related to the competition.
- F. The winning Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies Champion Quilt will not be eligible to compete in any future District and/or Convention OAAS competition.

Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies Machine-Quilted Quilt Competition

Eligibility, Rules and Regulations (for classes 1 through 7)

- A. Quilt must be solely made and machine quilted by the exhibitor and exhibited and judged at a local Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies (OAAS) fair to be eligible for this competition.
- B. Quilt to be measured on the perimeter. Total perimeter measurement to be a minimum of 324". Note the article can be square, rectangular etc.
- C. Judging will occur at local fairs and district levels. A Provincial Grand Champion Machine Quilted Quilt will be selected at the Annual OAAS Convention.
- D. Upon making entry into the OAAS Machine Quilting Competition, the Exhibitor agrees to participate in any promotional activities related to the competition.
- E. The winning OAAS Machine Quilted Quilt will not be eligible to compete in any future District and/or OAAS Provincial competition.
- F. The winner's name to be displayed at the Fair on sign provided by OAAS.
- G. Quilt must have visible machine quilting.

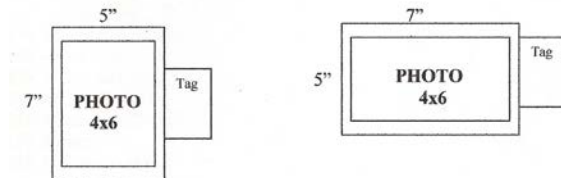
Photo Mounting: Entries not meeting the following guidelines will not be considered.

1. All entries (4"x6" photos) to be appropriately and securely mounted on **black bristol board** only, no larger than 5"x7". To hang properly, use the hook portion velcro adhesive dots or strips on the back of your entries. Four dots or small strips of velcro should be sufficient to support each entry. (does not have to be name brand Velcro)

So ... just which portion is the hook and which portion is the loop?

The hook of Velcro brand fasteners look like an upside-down letter "J". Hook is often described in different terms - the "rough" or the "bristly" portion. The hook portion engages into the loop component of our panels.

Please attach Velcro to the back of each mounted photo to display during the fair.



2. No enlargements unless stated.
3. All pictures to be in colour unless otherwise stated.
4. Photographs not suitable for family viewing will not be judged or displayed.
5. If more than one photo requested, mount with a ½ inch border.
6. Photos to have been taken within the last two (2) years, unless otherwise stated.

3.00 mm needles
3.25 mm needles

Abbreviations: st = stitch, st st = stocking stitches, K = knit, Kbl = knit into the back of the loop, P = purl, K2tog = knit two together

Tension: 32 sts = 10 cms (4 inches) in stocking stitch using 3.25 mm needles (check your tension to save time)

Instructions:

With 3 mm needles, cast on 80 sts. Work in (Kb1.P1) ribbing for 8 cm (3-1/2 ins.) Change to 3.25 mm needles and work on st st for 5 cm (2 ins), ending with right side facing for next row.

To shape top:

Row 1: (K8.K2tog) 8 times.

Row 2 and all even rows: Purl

Row 3: (K7.K2tog) 8 times.

Row 5: (K6.K2tog) 8 times.

Row 7: (K5.K2tog) 8 times.

Continue decreasing in this manner until you have completed the row (K2tog) 8 times.

Break yarn and thread end through remaining 8 sts.

Finishing:

Sew back seam edge to edge. Weave in yarn end.
